Four Strand Double Cow's Hitch

Some more complicated tutorials may tell you to make a four strand double cow's hitch for the base of the bracelet. This tutorial will walk you through the process.



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Materials

Paracord for your project

Buckle



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Step 1: Fold your cord in half and insert the ends down through one side of the buckle.



Step 2: Pull the ends until you have a loop the length needed for your bracelet. Then place one cord end on each side of your loop.



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Step 3: Starting with cord A, bring it up through the loop and cross it to the right.



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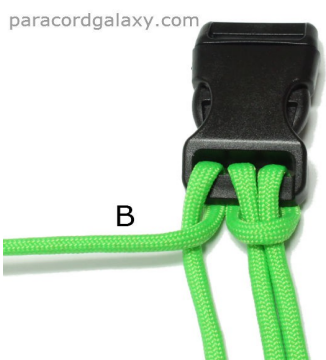
Step 4: Insert A up through the back of the buckle and under itself. Pull tight.



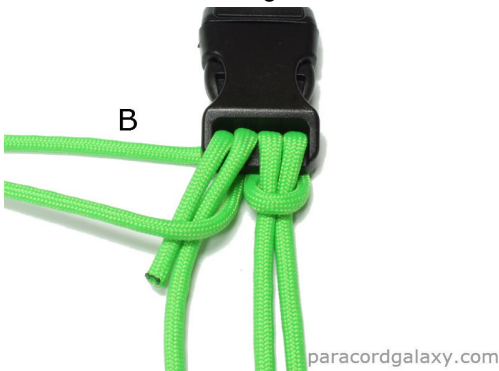
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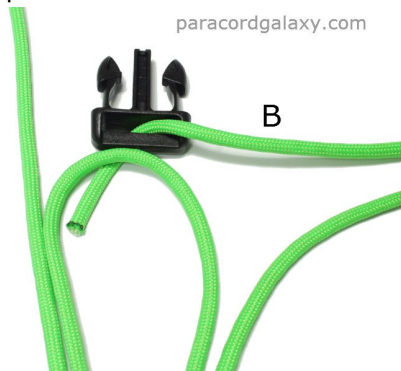
Now you should have one cow's hitch on the right.



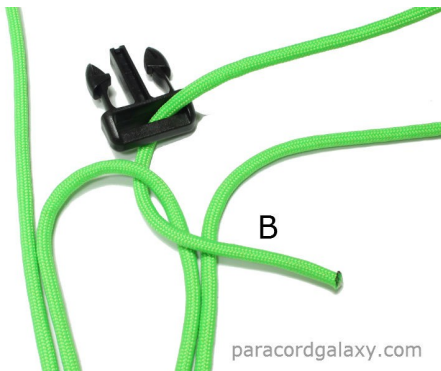
Step 5: Now bring cord B up through the loop and cross it over to the left.



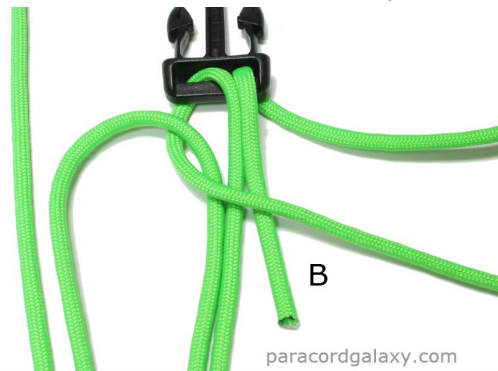
Step 6: Bring B up through the back of the buckle and down under itself. Pull tight to form a second cow's hitch.



Step 7: At the bottom of the loop, bring cord B down through the other end of the buckle and under the loop.



Step 8: Cross cord B over the right side of the loop and over itself.



Step 9: Bring cord B up through the back of the buckle at the right of the first and then bring it under itself. Pull tight.



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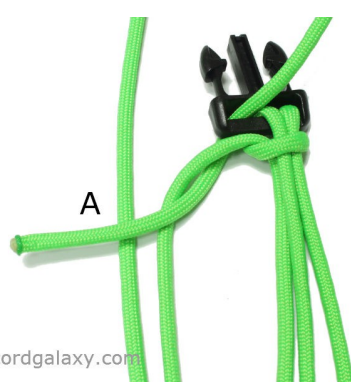


You should have a new cow's hitch with the working end on the outside.

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Step 10: With cord A, insert the end down through the buckle and under the loop.



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Step 11: Cross A over the left side of the loop and itself.

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Step 12: Now bring A up through the back of the buckle to the left of the other cords then under itself.

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You should now have two cow's hitch knots on each buckle end with four core strands.



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If needed, this can easily be turned into a six strand core by inserting each working end up through the cow's hitch knot.
