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Patterns

Herringbone Stitch Cobra Bracelet



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Materials:

1 Cobra or Solomon Bracelet

7-8 feet of Micro cord

1 Fid or lacing needle

{Cost for this project starts at \$3.69}



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If you don't have a micro cord size lacing needle, insert a small piece of 550 paracord into your needle. Melt the free end well and stick your micro cord to the melted part and hold until it cools.



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Step 1: Insert the needle and cord through the first loop on the side of your bracelet as shown. Pull through until you have about three inches left.



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Pull your free end around the buckle and tie an overhand knot to help keep the cord in place.



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Step 2: Thread your cord down under the tied micro cord.



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Step 3: Bring your needle and cord down through the same hole as before and under your cord. Pull tight. This should form a small knot.



Step 4: Insert your needle down through the loop across from the first as shown. Pull tight.



Step 5: Bring the needle under the line you just made going toward the bracelet and pull the cord through.



Step 6: Insert the needle through the same hole as in step 4 making sure to go over the micro cord. Pull tight.



Continue working steps 4-6 starting with the next loop up until you reach the end.



Once you reach the end of your bracelet, insert the needle and cord down through the center of the bracelet as shown.



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For added security, thread the needle and cord through the first couple of stitches down the center of the bracelet.



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Trim and melt the end. Repeat with the opposite side.
