

King Cobra Bracelet



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Materials:

18-20 ft of 550 paracord

Adjustable Shackle

{Cost starts at \$5.49}

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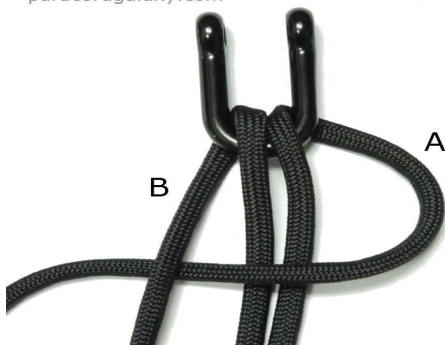
Thread the paracord through the large hole on the adjuster part of your shackle until you reach the middle of the cord.

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Measure the length you want the finished bracelet to be. Bring the cords around the shackle.

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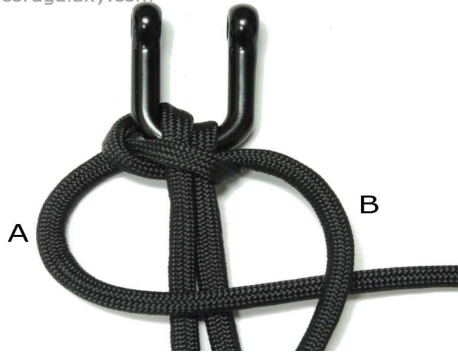
Step 1: Bring the right side A over the middle two cords and under side B.



Step 2: Bring side B under the middle cords and up through the loop created by side A. Pull tight.

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Step 3: Now bring side A which is now on the left over the middle cords and under side B.

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Continue steps 1 though 4 until you reach the end of your bracelet.

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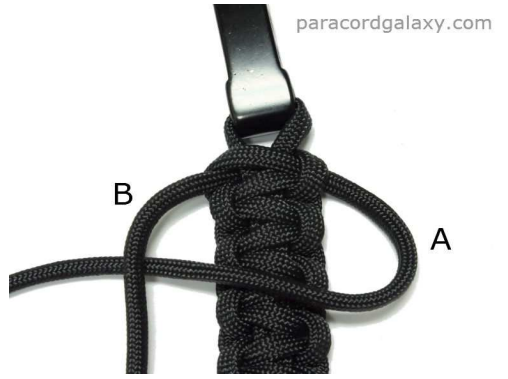
Step 6: Bring side B under the braid and up through the loop created by side A.

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Step 4: Bring side B under the middle cords and through the loop created by side A. Pull tight.

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Step 5: Start braiding over the existing braid by bringing side A over the braid and under side B.

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Pull tight and adjust so the new layer fits between the knots of the first layer. Then repeat steps 5 and 6.

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Once you reach the end of the bracelet, pull the last knot tight and cut and melt the ends.



This can also be done with two colors. Just use ten feet of each color. Use the first color for steps 1 through 4, then trim and melt the ends. Then use the second color for steps 5 and 6.
