

Shark Jaw Bracelet



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Materials:

Two 5 ft pieces of 550 paracord

One buckle

{Cost for this project starts at \$1.99}



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Step 1: Using a lighter or match, melt and join the two pieces of cord together.



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Step 2: Insert the middle down through one end of the buckle forming a loop.



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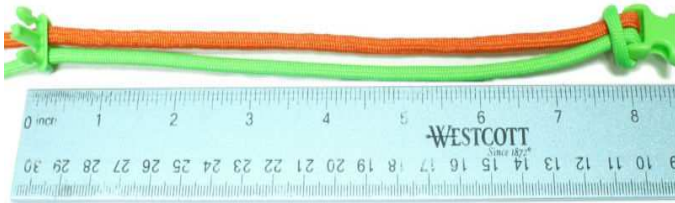
Step 3: Bring both free ends down through the loop.



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Pull both ends until the loop is tight. Make sure the joined section is off to the side so it is hidden from view.

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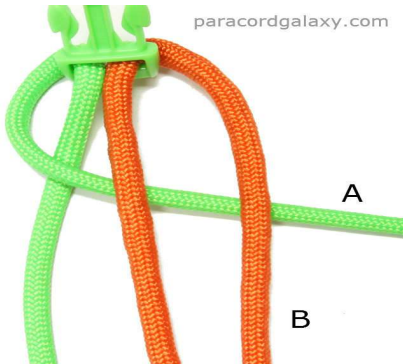
Step 4: Insert both cord ends down through the other side of the buckle. Measure the cord between the buckle sides to the desired length.



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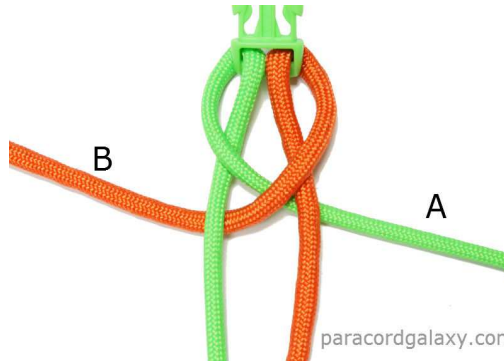
core strands

Bring the working ends to each side. Note: the core strands are the lengths of cord between each side of the buckle.



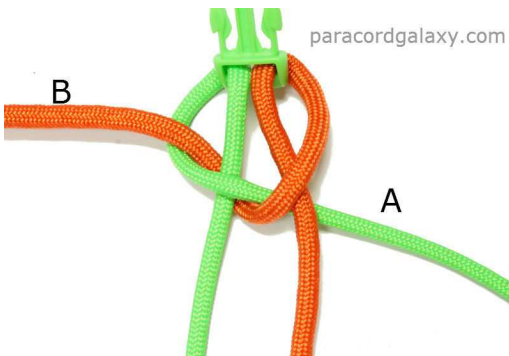
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Step 5: Bring cord A down through the middle of the core strands and under cord B.



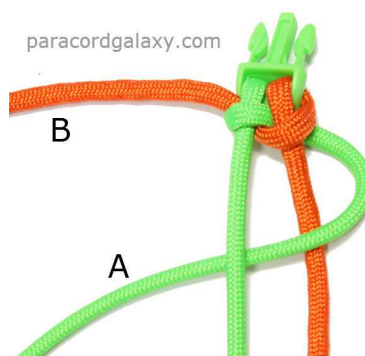
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Step 6: Bring cord B down through the middle of the core strands making sure it is below cord A.



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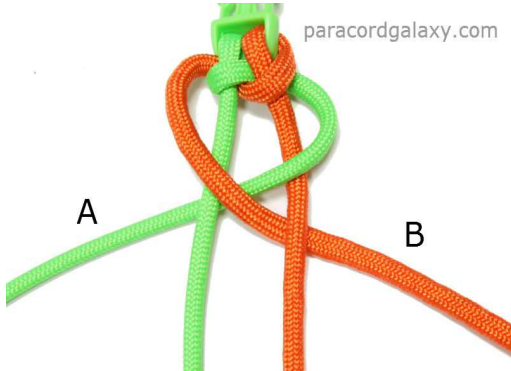
Step 7: Bring cord B up through the loop created by cord A as shown. Tighten the knot being careful not to shorten the length of your bracelet.



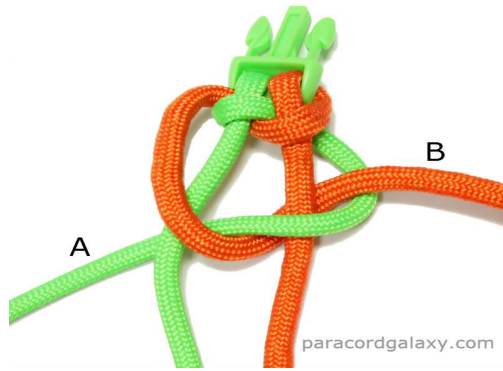
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Step 8: Again starting with cord A, bring it down the middle of the core strands.

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Step 9: Bring cord B down through the middle of the core strands making sure it is below cord A.



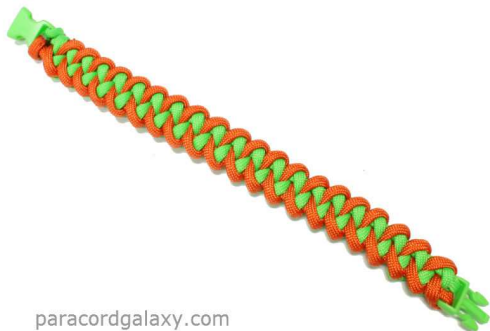
Step 10: Bring cord B up through the loop created by cord A as shown.



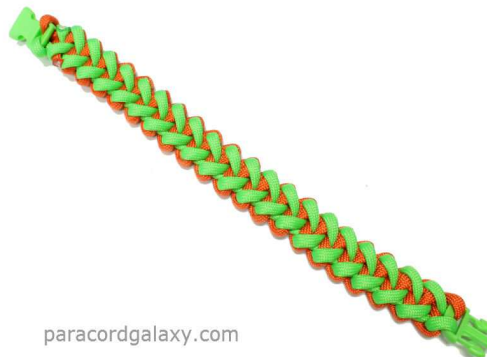
Tighten and repeat steps 5 through 10 until you reach the other end.



Once you reach the other side, trim and melt the ends.



This pattern is fun and easy.



As well as reversible!
